Quo Vadis Days is a time of recreation, fellowship, prayer, and discussions to help you explore our Lord's call in your life. There will be priests, seminarians, and other young men like yourself gathered together for these days. Activities will include prayer (Holy Mass, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Liturgy of the Hours, Rosary, etc.), games, bonfires, recreation and sports (soccer, capture the flag, volleyball, Ultimate Frisbee, flag football), talks, great food, and discussions.

The annual retreat is hosted by the Diocesan Office of Vocations, and provides high school and college-age participants with ample time for prayer, Adoration, presentations and discussions with Diocesan priests and seminarians – as well as a healthy dose of sports, recreation and meals.

Throughout the week, priests and seminarians share presentations and personal perspectives with the retreatants, who get a feel for seminary life in the dorm rooms, exploring the grounds and praying the Liturgy of the Hours.
